10.3 Council of Mayors South East Queensland (CoMSEQ) Committee Report

Current committee and taskforce activities for Council of Mayors (SEQ) are reported.

Officer's Recommendation:

THAT Council receive and note the Council of Mayors, South East Queensland Committee Report.

Report

1. Introduction

Lockyer Valley Regional Council is an active member of Council of Mayors (SEQ) and this report is intended to provide Council with a summary of activity and key matters focusing on the committee and taskforce meetings.

2. Background

Since the previous report provided, there have been a number of key actions and activities undertaken by Council of Mayors (SEQ) which will be of interest to the Lockyer Valley.

3. Report

Since the last Council of Mayors (SEQ) report to Council the following update on activities have been provided to Council:

Board Meeting of Council of Mayors (SEQ)

The Council of Mayors (SEQ) Board Meeting was held on Friday 25 September in Brisbane and also featured the SEQ Recreational Facilities Annual General Meeting and another Resilient Rivers Meeting.

The SEQ Recreational Facilities AGM saw the election of the same board that has been in place for a number of years including the retention of Mr Jamie Simmonds.

The board meeting discussed various issues on the agenda including:

- Olympic-bid pre-feasibility
- Usual portfolio updates from Economic Development, Infrastructure and Planning and Waterways and Environment (see further detail below)
- An update from LAGQ on the Better Councils Better Communities campaign
- The endorsement of directors for SEQ Catchments was also discussed.

Resilient Rivers Taskforce

There have been two Resilient Rivers meetings since the last report to Council including the initial meeting which saw Cr Graham Quirk elected as Chair and Cr Karen Williams as Deputy Chair of the Committee.

The terms of reference were accepted by the Taskforce. The taskforce also:

- Endorsed the Draft Regional Strategy 2015-2025
- Endorsed the priority investment projects 2015-2018
- Nominated Albert/Logan and Pumicestone Passage Catchment Action Plans to commence development in 2016
- Retained the existing Catchment Action Plans working Group to assist the Taskforce with operational aspects of the program.

Update on Economic Development Committee

The most recent meeting of the Economic Development Committee was held on Friday 7 August in Brisbane. The Deputy Mayor represented Council at this meeting. Items of discussion included:

- Smart region initiative
- APCS 2015
- Investment attraction
- Regional tourist Drive

The next meeting for Economic Development Committee is scheduled for Friday 9 October.

Update on Infrastructure and Planning Committee

The most recent meeting of the Infrastructure and Planning Committee was held on Friday 14 August in Brisbane. Cr Holstein represented Council at the meeting. Items for discussion included:

- SEQ Regional Plan and State Government reform
- Infrastructure Funding and the Economic Growth Partnership Model
- Strategic Planning Improvement Project
- DA Monitoring Project

The committee discussed the above items and agreed to continue engagement with the State Government once its plans had been released.

Since the last committee meeting the two directions papers have been released by the State Government. It is proposed a discussion will take place at the next committee meeting regarding these papers.

The next meeting of the Infrastructure and Planning Committee is scheduled for Friday 16 October when presentations are expected to be given by the Australian Rail Track Corporation and the Port of Brisbane.

Update on Waterways and Environment Committee

The most recent meeting of the Waterways and Environment Committee was held on Friday 21 August in Brisbane. Cr McDonald represented Council at this meeting. Items for discussion included:

- Waterways Management
- Resource recovery and waste management

The committee noted the Resilient Rivers Taskforce outcomes of 24 July, 2015. Some discussion was held regarding how the committee may be able to assist the Taskforce now that it is in place.

Discussion was had around the Green Army Round 4 project application. Seven Councils have put forward potential projects and Council of Mayors is working with Conservation Volunteers Australia to develop the application.

The next meeting scheduled for this committee is Friday 23 October.
